While waste management has improved compared to the last fiscal year, there has been a slight increase in water and energy consumption due to a 6.70% rise in guest nights, from 78,313 in FY 2022-2023 to 83,562 in FY 2023-2024. This growth has contributed to higher usage of electricity and water, as well as increased waste generation during the current fiscal year.

Solar Power Generation and Rainwater Harvesting

"Our focus on clean energy has been a priority since the inception of the resort. We have installed 1,125 solar panels, covering an area of 1,920 square meters, which generate a substantial kilowatt peak (KWP) output, effectively meeting the resort's energy needs. Our commitment to progress doesn't end here; we are continuously exploring new initiatives to further expand our renewable energy production capabilities."

Wet Garbage Digester Machine



"We follow stringent waste management practices by segregating waste at its origin and transporting it to designated disposal areas for optimal solutions. Wet waste is processed through our Wet Garbage Digester Machine, which transforms it into valuable soil enhancements. During 2023-24, we converted 66,590 kg of wet garbage into 15,645 kg of eco-friendly soil additives.

Additionally, waste cooking oil and lubricant oil are carefully collected and transferred to a renowned supplier for refining into various products and services. This initiative, launched in 2024, has not only enhanced our sustainability efforts but also generated revenue from waste oil at the property."

"Sustainability is deeply embedded in our brand DNA. As a signatory to the UNWTO's Responsible Tourism - Global Code of Ethics for Tourism, sustainability is integral to how we operate and manage our resort.

We take pride in being the Maldives' first LEED Certified property and the first Green Rated Building, recognized by the Green Building Council of Sri Lanka.

In 2024, we reached another sustainability milestone by achieving the prestigious Green Globe Standard 1.7 with an impressive score of 87%.

This accolade underscores our unwavering dedication to sustainability stewardship and leadership in responsible tourism within one of the world's most pristine marine environments." Additionally, all Adaaran properties are certified with HACCP and ISO 22000:2018 food safety certifications, demonstrating our commitment to group quality standards.

IN-HOUSE VEGETABLE GARDEN

If you have gone through our previous sustainability report for the financial years, you will be well aware of our in-house vegetable garden.

Our dedicated groundskeeping team and associates came up with the idea to maintain a garden during the lockdown period. We have continued working on our vegetable garden even with the hotel operation at its peak.

During this year, we were able to harvest a total of 515.68 Kg of vegetables, and 1,885 numbers of coconuts worth USD 4,115.

SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS

We strive to foster eco-consciousness across all areas of our business and society, investing our knowledge, time, and resources in sustainable tourism as responsible corporate citizens. Here are a few of the projects we've hosted during the financial years:

Biodiversity Day Awareness Program

On May 22nd, a Biodiversity Day awareness program was held at Raa Meedhu School, engaging 30 students and 2 associates. The event focused on educating students about the importance of biodiversity and the need for its protection in their local environment.

Book Donation to Kinolhahu School

In August 2023, a book donation event was held at Kinolhahu School, benefiting 25 students. A total of \$200 worth of books were donated, with the participation of 5 associates from the organization.

Learning Scholarship – The Butler Program

In December 2023, the 6th True Art of Service – The Butler Program was conducted, involving 15 associates and 1 student from the Raa Atoll. As part of this CSR initiative, a training scholarship valued at \$2,000 was awarded to a school leaver from the Raa Atoll.

Children's Day Celebration

On May 10th, associates from Heritance Aarah visited Meedhu Pre School to celebrate Children's Day. The event involved 30 students and 10 associates, where the associates provided cakes and cookies to the children as part of the celebration.

Heritance Aarah Biodiversity Survey



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The last fiscal year has been a rewarding one for Heritance Aarah, and as the L&D business partner of the organization, we are proud to have successfully completed some exciting trainings and projects.

During the fiscal year 2023/24, we achieved an increase in per person training hours at Heritance Aarah, rising from 24 to 34 hours, reflecting a 10-hour improvement compared to the previous year.

Highlights include achieving the world-renowned Green Globe sustainability certification, conducting comprehensive audits and documentation, and rolling out the HO3 Heritance Aarah Service Culture Training drive. We also implemented the sector Learning Menu, completed the 7S+ Industrial Housekeeping Certification training and audits, and hosted signature programs like the Butler Development Program and the Tea Master's Competition.

Aitken Spence Resorts entered Maldives, bringing significant investment, renowned Sri Lankan hospitality, and sustainability strategies. As part of the UNWTO's Responsible Tourism initiative, sustainability is ingrained in our ethos, guiding how we operate and manage our resort operations.

2016: Began our sustainability journey with the Travelife Gold certification, becoming the first international chain to pledge our sustainability policy underwater.

2016: Initiated structured sustainability policies with effective management, auditing, and documentation, published annually in sustainability reports.

2017: Launched a Sustainability and UN Celebration Days Activity Calendar to engage associates in sustainability and social activities.

2017: Introduced Talent Development reports to highlight our initiatives in developing talent.

2017: Started Adaaran Kurimagu, a Management Training program for young Maldivians as part of our CSR efforts.

2019: Launched our plastic-free islands initiative by installing a water bottle plant at Meedhupparu, now producing 900,000 glass bottles annually across all properties.

2019: Built and opened the Maldives' first LEED-certified (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) resort at Heritance Aarah, setting a new standard for sustainable resort development in the region.

2019: Introduced paper straws, cups, plates, and biodegradable bags to further support the plastic-free initiative.

2000: Launched the Coral Replantation project to help save the ocean's ecosystems.

2021: Began measuring sustainable practices under the Sustainability Retrospect column, focusing on social, economic, and environmental aspects.

2021: Launched the Maldivian Village live museum experience at Heritance Aarah to preserve and showcase Maldivian heritage.

2022: Conducted the "We Love Trees" Campaign to document flora and fauna across all resorts, emphasizing environmental conservation.

2023: Invested in a Wet Garbage Digester Machine to enhance waste management and repurpose waste as soil enhancements.

2024: Achieved Green Globe Certification for the entire sector, marking a significant milestone in our sustainability journey.
